Community Conversations



- a series of meetings for residents, local interests, surrounding communities and property owners to engage on certain topics.
- presentations that shared a detailed background of initiatives related to each topic sharing Village and surrounding communities' initiatives with the corresponding results of the recent "Workbook" questionnaire.
- ideas and input shared in each conversation will direct the Village's preparation of the key policy directions and actions to be included in the updated Official Community Plan.
- Participation ranged from 10-30 per session with total hits on YouTube as approximately 774 viewers (note there is duplication in counts as there is no way of determining unique viewers).

Community Conversations



The Community Conversations were held earlier this year from late February to late April, as follows:

- February 23 – Economic Development
- February 25 – Housing
- March 4 – Parks and Trails
- March 5 – Food Security and Agriculture
- March 11 – Infrastructure and Community Facilities
- April 16 – Emergency Preparedness
- April 20 – Lytton Identity

The input from those in attendance and key themes are summarized in the Progress Report Appendix #2. Input was received in person and on-line.

University of Fraser Valley



As per the earlier delegation, the strategic areas of their research included:

- Economic Development
- Tourism
- Building Climate Resiliency
- Mobility,
- Housing, and
- Supportive Services.

The intent of the project is to better understand what attracts new residents to a small community such as Lytton. The primary focus was to understand young workers in their 20s and 30s and retaining residents of this demographic.

Results will further complement the findings of the proposed student and young adult engagement initiatives which will take place through late May to mid June.

Local Youth & Young Adult Outreach



It is crucial to directly reach out to children, teens, and young adults currently living in Lytton and the surrounding communities, as their ideas, aspirations and needs are key to a vibrant Village in the future.

- Youth (student) engagement will take place at the local schools and with a school approved questionnaire.
- Staff and consultants are developing fun and creative ways to engage youth in OCP Update process.
- Young Adult (18-30 yrs) will be engaged through a online questionnaire advertised via Village communication channels and social media.

Final Phases & Ongoing Outreach



Remaining before Statutory Bylaw Approval (Public Hearing) Process:

- Youth and Young Adult Outreach
- Technical Environmental and Geotechnical Investigations
- **Update OCP including vision, policies, actions and maps**
- Draft Document Engagement and Input which will section the draft document comprehensible components to ensure that the public is not overwhelmed with too many changes or new directions)
- **Complete referrals** to surrounding communities (Nlaka'pamux and TNRD), senior government agencies, not for profits and any others that have requested information.
