FUNDING

Background

Government of Canada

- Infrastructure Canada has committed \$64 million
- Funding to support rebuilding Lytton through construction of net-zero, fire-resistant public buildings
- Village needs to identify priorities to apply for grant funding

FUNDING

Background

Province of BC

- \$21 million to support the following priorities in the Village's recovery plan including:
 - Restoring crucial services, such as fire protection
 - Reconstructing key municipal infrastructure, including the Public Works Building
 - Completing backfilling of properties

FUNDING

Background

Other Infrastructure Funding

- \$17.4 million to support the following priorities in the Village's recovery plan including:
 - \$5 million for water system upgrades – Province of BC
 - \$8 million for wastewater upgrades – Province of BC and Government of Canada
 - \$4.4 wastewater upgrades – Province of BC

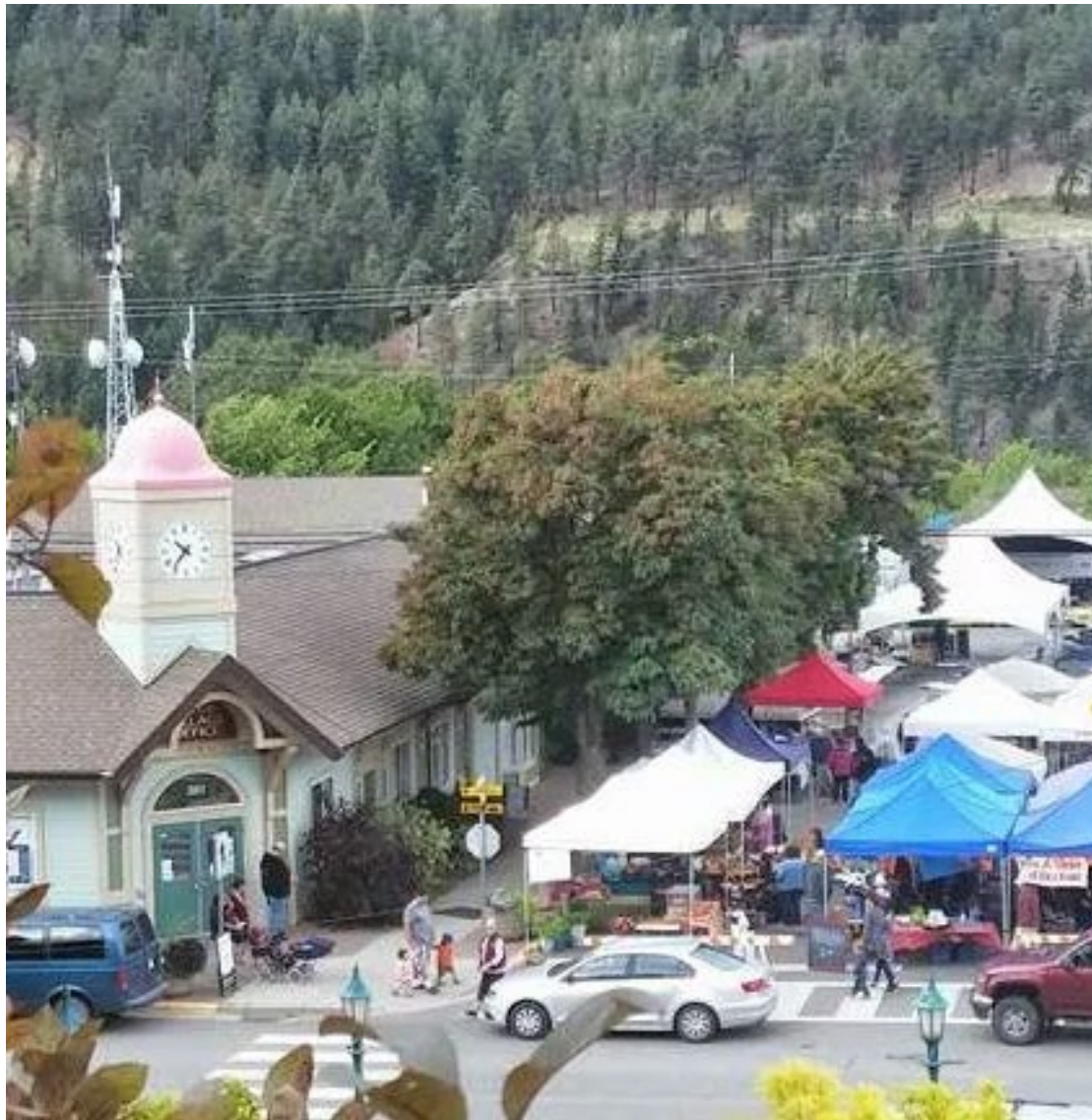
