Dear Lytton residents, businesses, and property owners,

When the Village of Lytton's Council was elected one year ago, we knew we had a difficult job ahead of us. While understanding how municipal government works *did* become easier, unravelling the previous year and a half and making decisions *did not*. We were told by many that recovery takes time and cannot be hurried. As a Council, we refused to make excuses. Instead, we focussed on priorities and kept our eyes on the goal of rebuilding our Village and community.

The following are some of Council's accomplishments over the first year of our term:

- Improved communication with our residents, property owners, and businesses through conversations, enewsletters, community meetings, and information on the Village website and Village of Lytton Facebook page
- Rescinded Building Bylaw 711 and replaced it with Bylaw 710: a bylaw that follows the current BC Building Code
- Adopted essential bylaws for moving forward, including a Council Procedure Bylaw, bylaws to support rebuilding such as zoning, development, and variances, and more
- Hired a recovery team of managers, who have been instrumental in helping to get us to the stage of rebuilding. They report directly to Council on their work with residents, partners, and contractors.
- Hired a Chief Administrative Officer/Chief Financial Officer. She has been providing trusted guidance to help us make informed decisions and hire needed staff.
- Addressed water infrastructure challenges, repaired a major water leak on Ponderosa, re-established water (non-potable) and sewer functioning in the Village core, and hired a water operator
- Completed soil remediation
- Completed backfilling and soil compaction for 90 per cent of the Village properties
- Opened the application process for building permits and issued the first residential building permit
- Removed the State of Local Emergency for the Village
- Opened a temporary Village Office at the former sawmill office site
- Entered into a lease agreement with the Anglican Church for use of the Parish Hall for Council meetings and events
- Supported residents, whose homes were still standing, to move back in
- Held a tax sale for the first time in three years. Provincial legislation requires municipalities to hold tax sales annually

Looking ahead, we plan to focus on the following:

- Continuing to build relationships and possible partnerships with neighbouring First Nation communities
- Addressing future water infrastructure needs
- Collaborating with our provincial partners
- FireSmarting our community
- Planning construction of municipal buildings and infrastructure
- Supporting and advocating for property owners with rebuilding or new construction
- Supporting returning businesses
- Supporting economic recovery and diversification
- Updating our Official Community Plan
- Continuing to engage with and advocate for the people of Lytton

The entire Council encourages you to reach out to us with questions, comments, or feedback. Let us know how we are doing. You elected us and we are committed to serving you!
