- The Village Office at 769 S- Trans Canada Highway is closed. A temporary Village Office has been set up in the Public Works Building at 30 Main Street and is open during regular business hours.

BC Wildfire Service update

The Saw Creek wildfire (K70597), status has been updated to Under Control, which ensures there will be no further spread.

Successful suppression efforts of both crew and aerial resources have directly influenced this update to the status.

This status reflects significant progress made through sustained suppression efforts by ground crews and aerial resources. Crews will remain on-site to continue patrols and extinguish hot spots.

Nearby communities may continue to see smoke from within the fire perimeter, and it is not a cause for concern. If you see smoke outside the fire perimeter, report it immediately at 1-800-663-5555, *5555 on a cell, or through the BC Wildfire Service app.
